Strategic Highlights

The Foundation continues to review areas of growth and how we can continue to increase the number of trips, while at the same time remaining sustainable. Our new Club Model is now being phased in, with a number of Clubs looking at forming a successful & long-term partnership with the Foundation, to help not only their own Club members but also the Community they serve.

Financial Highlights

While though the Foundations overall performance was impacted greatly by the COVID-19 pandemic, our total income still showed a slight increase, of 3% for the year to \$671,121.33. With expenses also slightly increasing from last year (+\$51.843.09) due to some one-off costs, in the areas of MV depreciation, wheel chair conversion, and Staff costs, the Foundation was still able to register a surplus of \$66,985.63 for the 2019/20 financial year.

Operating Highlights

The Foundation through the kind support of its sponsors, donors, as well as NSW and Federal Government grants was able to add two (2) new Vehicles ,to its fleet with the purchase of a new KIA Carnival purposely built wheelchair vehicle the highlight. Also, with the unprecedented event of the COVID-19 crisis resulting in the Foundations unfortunate decision to cease its FREE Medical Transport service for 3 months, we were able to review our systems, and procedures to even further streamline our operation in order to not only continue to provide the service, but also grow and expand it to the wider community, in a more resourceful, effective & sustainable way.

In a year of great change and uncertainty lets hope that we can continue to make our community a better place, a friendlier place and a happier place for all.

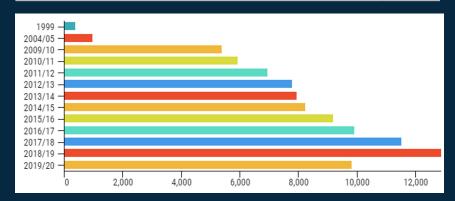

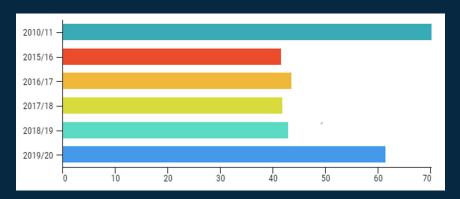

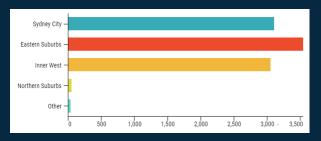

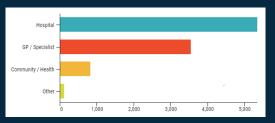
